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Nomadic Adventure at Gun Galuut Nature Reserve

Date: June to August **Price:** Starts from \$300



Trip Summary

Gun Galuut Nature Reserve, nestled in the scenic valley of the Kherlen River near the Khentii Mountains, was established in 2003 to protect the region's rich biodiversity. The reserve is home to a variety of nationally and globally endangered species, including Argali sheep, Siberian cranes,

White-naped cranes, Black vultures, and Swan geese. In the early 2000s, marmots, once extinct in the valley, were successfully reintroduced. The mountains of Baits and Berkh provide a vital sanctuary for these remarkable species, making the reserve a true haven for wildlife.

Itinerary

Day 1: Chinggis Khan Statue & Gun Galuut Reserve

Start your day with a visit to the towering Chinggis Khan Equestrian Statue and its museum complex. Climb to the top for panoramic views, then continue to the 13thcentury complex to experience archery, horseback riding, and a traditional Mongolian lunch. In the evening, transfer to Gun Galuut Nature Reserve. **(Ger camp; L, D)**

Day 2: Gun Galuut to Ulaanbaatar

Enjoy a morning of hiking, horseback riding, or optional fishing in the scenic landscapes of Gun Galuut. After lunch, return to Ulaanbaatar. **(B, L)**

Wild Journey to Hustai National Park

Date: Throughout the year **Price:** Starts from \$340



Trip Summary

Hustai National Park is one of only 3 sites where the wild horses, known as Takhi or Przewalski's Horses. have been successfully reintroduced over the past decades. After the last wild two individuals disappeared from Mongolia in late 1960s. genetically the pure Przewalski's horses were bred in European zoos and later reintroduced into three distinct habitats in Mongolia. In Hustai, we will have the rare opportunity to observe these magnificent, truly wild their natural horses in steppe environment. The Takhi's reintroduction stands as one of the few successful cases of a large mammal being brought back into its former range after local extinction

Itinerary

Day 1: Hustai National Park

In the morning, transfer to Hustai National Park, situated 120 km west of Ulaanbaatar. (2-hour drive). Upon arrival, check into your gers. After lunch, visit the local information center and watch a documentary on Takhi horses. Explore this diverse park of natural grasslands, mountains, and river shores with further encounters with Takhi herds. Overnight at the camp. (Ger camp; L, D)

Day 2: Visit Nomadic Family/Ulaanbaatar

In the morning, explore more of Hustai National Park with an optional visit to a local herder family and the nearby 7th-century Ongot Turkic monuments. After lunch at the camp, return to Ulaanbaatar. (B, L)

Hike & Meditate at Terelj National Park

Date: Throughout the year **Price:** Starts from \$320



Trip Summary

Located only 70 km east of Ulaanbaatar, the Terelj National Park offers explorers an opportunity to experience Mongolian wilderness up close. It is located on the confluence of two major river systems: Tuul and Terelj. It has many well-established offers excellent ger camps and horseback riding and hiking opportunities in its spectacular valley. It has interesting rock formations, millions of years old, and has a very rich plant life.

Itinerary

Day 1: Terelj National Park

In the morning, visit the iconic Chinggis Khaan Equestrian Statue, featuring a museum, exhibits, and shops. Climb to the horse's head for panoramic views of the Tuul River valley. Continue to Terelj National Park and settle into a ger camp. After lunch, enjoy horseback riding or visit a local family. Dinner and overnight at the camp. (Ger camp; L, D)

Day 2: Ariyabal meditation temple/ Ulaanbaatar

In the morning, visit Ariyabal Monastery, a Tibetan-style meditation temple originally built in the 19th century and later rebuilt after the 1930s purges. Enjoy a peaceful hike in the surrounding area before returning to the ger camp for lunch. In the afternoon, drive back to the city. (L)

Souvenirs:
